Program:

The Book Scholarship Program provides a maximum of \$250 per student to WHA residents. Scholarship grants are paid on a first-come, first-served basis. The approval and payment of any scholarship grant is based solely on the discretion of the WHA Board of Commissioners. The Board of Commissioners determines the amount of funds to be allocated to the Book Scholarship Program on a per semester basis; once the allocated funds for a given semester are exhausted, no further scholarship grants will be paid. The WHA makes no representation that the book scholarship program will continue in the future.

Eligibility:

Participants must be a WHA resident enrolled as a full-time student in a post-secondary Higher Education Institution or certificate program. Applicants must be enrolled as full-time students at a post-secondary higher education institution, trade, or certificate program. Scholarship grants may only be used for the current term/semester. The scholarship grant must be the sole source of reimbursement for the applicant's purchase of books and cannot be used in conjunction with any other grant offering reimbursement for the cost of books. In the event of high demand, The WHA may limit each applicant to one scholarship grant per school year. The applicant's receipt of a scholarship grant does not guarantee the receipt of any future scholarship grant.
